


Noble Care tailors our services to meet you where you are and help you get to where you want to go.

NobleCare’s wide range of options are designed and delivered with one very focused goal: to improve and maintain our residents’ ability to live as independently as possible in their homes.

Our Direct Support Professionals work with individuals and their caretakers in agency-managed residential group or private homes in York and Cumberland counties in Maine.

Sample, specific services may include:

- 1 **Daily Living Skills Training:** Staff members work closely with each resident to develop individualized plans that help master essential life skills, including personal hygiene, simple meal preparation, and finance management.
- 2 **Behavioral Support:** NobleCare provides staff with training in supportive interventions, such as behavior management programs and individualized plans to address behavior challenges generally associated with various Autism levels. Staff members are trained to understand and manage behavior with positivity as they promote new skill learning for all residents.

- 3 **Socialization and Community Integration:** Residents are encouraged to interact and build relationships with peers, staff, and the community through various activities to foster a sense of belonging and increase their overall well-being.

- 4 **Medical and Therapeutic Services** may include assistance with medication management, ordering, administering, and storing per the state of Maine and their medical team’s direction.

Eligibility Requirements: An individual must be enrolled in and have MaineCare and Waiver Section 21 or 29 funding through the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Aging and Disability Services to be considered to work with NobleCare’s home support services.
